#### **General Information**

Students majoring in other Douglas College bachelor degree programs can choose to earn a Minor in Psychology. Psychological theory, research and practice complement many other disciplines including: business administration, marketing, nursing, criminology, child and youth care, social work, therapeutic recreation, and sport science and coaching.

The structure of the Minor in Psychology is thirty (30) credits. In order to complete this designation, students will need to complete the following requirements. A final grade of C (2.0) or better is required in each course. **NOTE:** This document is accurate as of June 2022. **You are ultimately responsible** for ensuring that any courses chosen will fulfill the requirements for this designation; therefore, carefully review the Douglas College Calendar and discuss your intended courses with an Advisor at Douglas College.
